

Scenic Notes:

Ride developed on Memorial Day 2003 by Alan Barta & John Satterlee w/ input from Paul Anderson. Name refers to two landmark towers on Rts. 1 & 3. Also honors historic Twin Tower Disaster & film debut of name-sake Tolkien story.

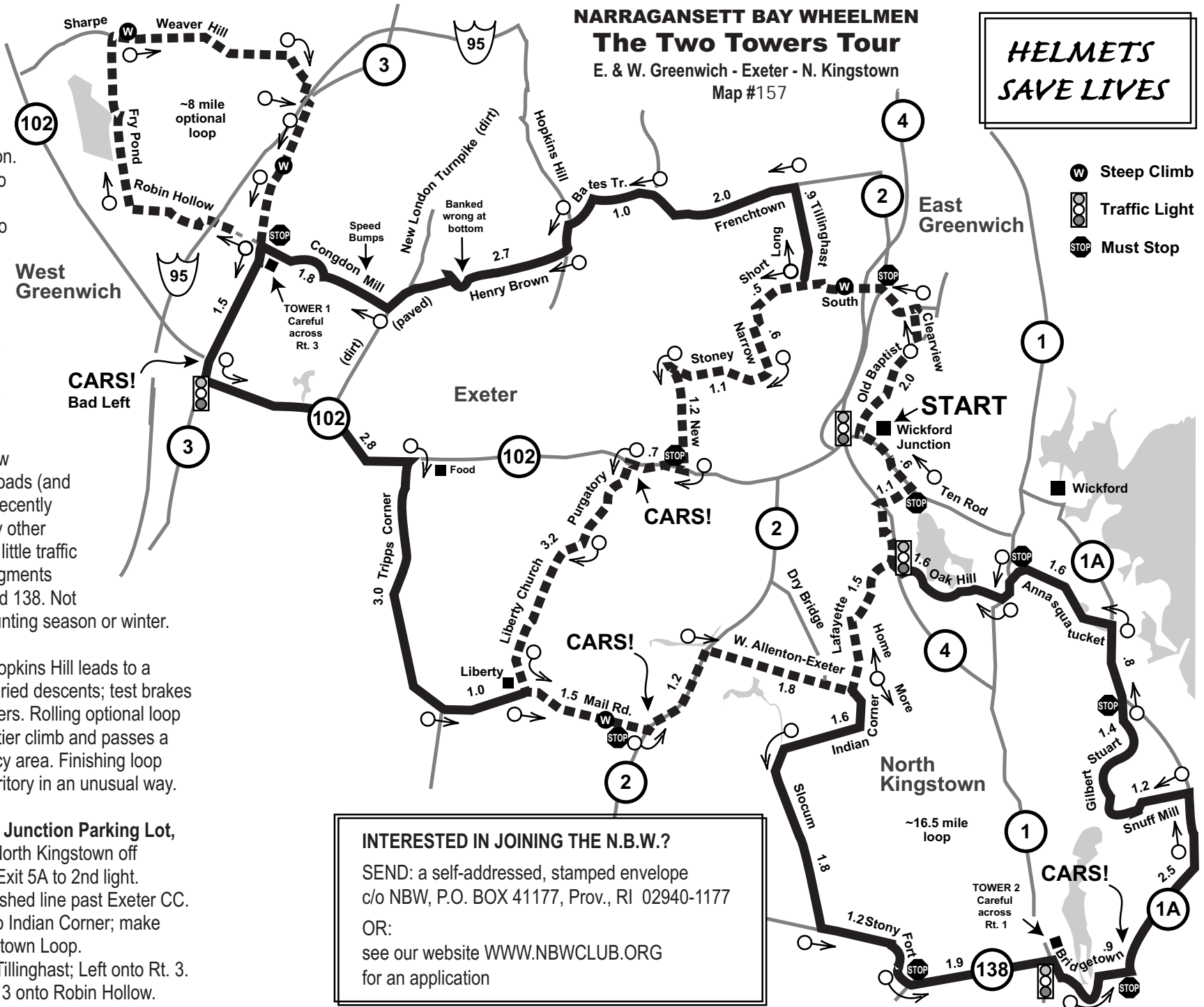
After bustling start (food available), ride soon turns wildly rural with few amenities. A few roads (and start) paved only recently and never used by other club rides. Expect little traffic on all but short segments of Rts. 1A, 2, 3 and 138. Not advised during hunting season or winter.

A slow climb up Hopkins Hill leads to a series of steep, varied descents; test brakes and watch for critters. Rolling optional loop has a unique five-tier climb and passes a nature conservancy area. Finishing loop covers familiar territory in an unusual way.

Start: Wickford Junction Parking Lot, Rt. 102, North Kingstown off Route 4, Exit 5A to 2nd light.
 17 mi.: Follow dashed line past Exeter CC.
 28 mi.: Right onto Indian Corner; make No. Kingstown Loop.
 44 mi.: Right on Tillinghast; Left onto Rt. 3.
 52 mi.: Cross Rt. 3 onto Robin Hollow.
